

Caltech and JPL scientists joined the Western Flyer crew on a research expedition to Lasuen Knoll (14 Mile Bank) off the coast of Newport Beach. Scientists deployed various monitoring equipment and remotely operated vehicles (ROVs) at historical Caltech test sites. Following the research expedition, KML hosted a "Science and Sunsets" event at the lab where guests could learn more about this historic vessel that once carried famed author, John Steinbeck, and inspired his famous *The Log from the Sea of Cortez*.




